Columbus Central (CC) is a highly configurable, framework, product that can be implemented in an infinite number of ways. This course is designed to provide delegates with a good working knowledge of Columbus Central installation & administration, as well as practical experience of using the Taskplan Editor. Although this course is based on the more common implementation and configuration options, there will be opportunities for delegates to discuss site-specific configurations.
