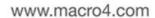

# **Columbus DW System Support Course**

### **Course Aims**

Columbus DW (CDW) is an online document warehouse for short, medium and long-term storage and retrieval of large volumes of electronic documents for web presentment, report distribution and online archiving.

This course provides participants with a technical overview of Columbus DW and practical experience of using, administering and maintaining the core product features. Whilst the course is based on the more common implementation and configuration options, the course will provide opportunities to discuss site-specific configurations.

The course is based on formal training notes and, wherever possible, presentations are supported by demonstrations and practical exercises.
